Words of Welcome | Executive Director | Congress Opening

Thank you for those words of welcome, Sister Catherine, Father Michael, and Sister Helen. It is an honor to share this stage with you tonight.

In the book **St Francis and the Foolishness of God**, the authors describe a setting in which Francis and Clare gather around a campfire one evening and talk about their love of God and all of creation. There they sit, huddled together, the embers and the light of the fire flickering, engaging in passionate conversation about God's love.

In fact, the story goes, the people of Assisi looked beyond the walls of the town, across the plain, and toward the forest where the Franciscan community of Francis and Clare lived. They saw a red and orange glow as if a great fire were raging. They rushed out of the city to put out the fire – only to discover Francis and Clare sitting and talking to one another.

The authors of **St. Francis and the Foolishness of God** ask us to imagine ourselves gathered around that campfire with Francis and Clare, the coolness of the evening offset by Fire, the Sun setting to the west and the Moon rising over the nearby mountains.

Tonight, and over the course of the next few days, Francis and Clare invite us to dialogue with Fire.

They ask us to consider the source of passion in our lives:

- What are we passionate about?
- Where do we find energy?
- What is our deepest joy?
- Are we moving toward it?

The authors say, and I quote:

The Fire within us can cause havoc, or it can lead us toward transformation. What about your passion for justice, our longing for peace? Perhaps that fiery passion is only a faintly glowing ember right now. Can we gently fan it until it reignites?

Francis and Clare invite us to be in dialogue with the Fire within each of us.

How do we befriend Fire, who comes to us in suffering, in mystery, in love?

How will we, as participants at the 2025 Congress, come to this space and these questions and lean in together toward the emerging, but largely unknown, future?

This is the work – and this is the transformation – Fire invites us to. This is God's mission-at-work in all of us.

Like the communion of saints before us -

Like the very people who processed in earlier to accompany us this weekend – we tend the radiant fire and fan the holy flames.

May we FLICKER with curiosity and embrace the creative questions, May we GLOW with courageous faith and unbridled hope, May our EMBERS fuel our passions and spark the best in each of us. And so, friends, welcome! It's good to have you join us around this weekend's CONGRESS CAMPFIRE. We're honored by your presence.
